**VALENCIA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO
GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ELECTION RESOLUTION AND PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, the Valencia County Board of Commissioners met upon notice of a Special Business Meeting, duly published, at the Valencia County Administration Building, 444 Luna Avenue, Los Lunas, New Mexico 87031 on Wednesday, July 27, 2022, at 5:00 PM as required by law; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") of Valencia County, New Mexico (the "County"), has determined upon its own initiative to submit to an election the question of the issuance of its general obligation bonds in the maximum amounts and for the purposes hereinafter specified without the prior filing of a petition by qualified electors; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Board that it is necessary and in the best interests of the residents of the County that there be submitted to a vote of the registered qualified electors of the County, the question of whether the County should issue its general obligation bonds for the purposes hereinafter specified pursuant to applicable laws of the State of New Mexico, and pursuant to Article IX, Section 10 of the New Mexico Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby determines and declares that the projects (the "Projects") for which the question of issuing the County's general obligation bonds (the "Bond Election Questions") as set forth herein, are for public purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF VALENCIA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the following general obligation bond questions called for by this Resolution shall be submitted to the registered qualified electors of Valencia County, New Mexico at the general election to be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022 (the "Election Date"):

Section 2. The Chair of the Board, County Clerk and County Manager are hereby authorized and directed to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Resolution.

Section 5. This Resolution and Proclamation shall be filed with the County Clerk immediately following adoption. The County Clerk is authorized and directed to take any and all steps necessary for the proper conduct of the election.





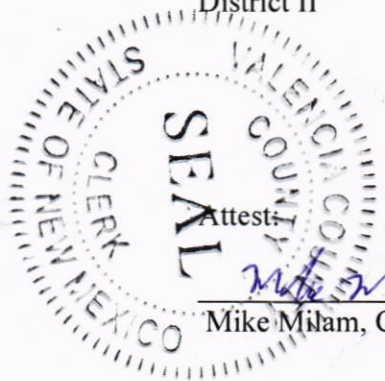

GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND QUESTIONS

Shall Valencia County issue up to \$1,000,000 of its general obligation bonds, to be repaid from property taxes, to construct, renovate, furnish, enhance and otherwise improve buildings for sheriff and fire department facilities?

For public safety bonds

Against public safety bonds

Shall Valencia County issue up to \$4,000,000 of its general obligation bonds, to be repaid from property taxes, to construct, rehabilitate, enhance and otherwise improve public roads, including purchasing capital equipment for such projects?

For road bonds

Against road bonds

Shall Valencia County issue up to \$1,500,000 of its general obligation bonds, to be repaid from property taxes, to construct, equip, renovate, enhance and otherwise improve and to acquire equipment for park and recreational facilities including public parks, swimming pools, splash pads, sports fields and other recreational facilities, open space, bike paths, Bosque lands and trails?

For parks and recreation bonds

Against parks and recreation bonds

Shall Valencia County issue up to \$1,500,000 of its general obligation bonds, to be repaid from property taxes, to construct, equip, renovate, enhance and otherwise improve County owned community centers, including those for families, youth and senior citizens?

For community enhancement bonds

Against community enhancement bonds
